**Notes:**

Jailer, Joshua Toomey, and employee, Pam Fuller, presented to the court. Their records show that 38% of the state inmates currently lodged at the Logan County Detention Center are local residents and expressed the importance of education within the jail in hopes to lower the re-entry percentage. Fuller gave a report on all of the classes offered at the Detention Center including a new employment and a new trauma class.

ECC Director, Ginger Lawrence, gave a year end recap of all calls taken at dispatch. ECC took a total of 42,131 phone calls in 2025. The Logan County Sheriff's Department responded to 17,570 of those calls and Logan County Animal Care and Control responded to 1,073 of those calls.

Ambulance Director, John Holder, presented a new option to have part-time staffing at the Auburn Ambulance Station. Com-Care has partnered with a hospital in Warren County to do patient transports. The funding from the transports allows Com-Care to afford the staffing in Auburn 3 days a week.
